

10 common household cables and wires to recycle

1USB Cables & Chargers – Old phone, tablet, and device chargers contain valuable copper wiring.

2 Headphones & Earbuds – Wired headphones have copper and sometimes aluminum inside.

3 Power Cords – Laptop chargers, extension cords, and appliance power cables can be stripped for metal.

4 Ethernet Cables (Cat5/Cat6) – Used for internet connections, these contain copper wires inside.

5HDMI Cables – Commonly used for TVs and gaming consoles, these have copper, aluminum, and gold-plated connectors.

6 Coaxial Cables – Used for cable TV and internet, these contain copper or aluminum shielding.

7Speaker Wires – Home theater or car audio wires often contain high-quality copper.

B Phone Cords (Landline Wires) – If you still have old landline cables, they're full of recyclable metal.

Ohristmas Lights – Broken holiday lights contain copper wiring that scrapyards will take. (Please keep lights in a separate box or pile)

Or Appliance Wiring – Old cords from small kitchen appliances, lamps, and power strips can be recycled.

Pro Tip: Even if the plastic coating is damaged, scrapyards want these because of the valuable metals inside! They can strip off the plastic and get the metal out to be melted down and turned into something new.
